Unit/Learning Segment: World War II and the Holocaust - Lesson 3 (Grades 8-11)

Topic: The role of the Italian people in saving Jews during the Holocaust - Part II Assisi Underground

Aim: To what extent were the efforts of the Assisi Underground successful in saving Jews during the Holocaust?

Information/Content:

During the German occupation, the town of Assisi under the direction of Bishop Nicolini and Father Brunacci established a rescue operation to save Jews. Churches, monasteries, and convents became the safe haven for people fleeing deportation to the death camps.

Developmental Activity and Procedures:

Read the common core reading **The Assisi Underground**. Define key vocabulary words and answer the guide questions.

Using evidence from the reading, write a response to the following: To what extent was the Assisi Underground's role in the resistance movement in Italy successful?
